CONTINUATION OF REPORT

I am a father of three children, aged between 8 and 13 years, and I reside at the address provided above. I have been employed in the public transport sector since 2006, and I approach my professional and parental responsibilities with the utmost seriousness.

****Incident Summary:****

On 6th September 2024, at approximately 15:32 hours, I was assigned a ride by Gojek, identified by job number RB-161961-2460634, with the designated pickup location at 124 Bedok Reservoir Road.

Upon my arrival at the aforementioned location, I was met by a male passenger of Chinese descent, exhibiting visible tattoos on his arms. After the passenger entered my vehicle, I proceeded to close the automatic side door and courteously reminded him to fasten his seatbelt for his own safety. The passenger vehemently insisted that there was no necessity for rear-seat occupants to wear seatbelts, asserting that they would be unharmed regardless. I endeavored to convey the importance of seatbelt use, emphasizing that, in the event of an accident, such precaution could potentially be life-saving. His response was dismissive, stating, "That's okay; anyway, the car doesn't belong to me. Just go ahead and crash."

Recognizing the futility of further discourse, I opted to remain silent for the duration of the journey, as the passenger's demeanor suggested possible affiliation with gang culture, as evidenced by his tattoos.

Upon reaching the destination, the passenger disbursed exact cash for the fare. I activated the automatic side door mechanism from the driver console; however, I concurrently observed the side auto door being forcibly opened from the inside. In response, I turned to the passenger and gently reminded him that the door was designed for automatic operation. Abruptly, he shouted loudly, insisting upon opening it himself. This action interrupted the automatic door's function, resulting in an audible mechanical conflict. He forcefully opened the door manually, generating a loud dragging noise from the auto door mechanism until it was fully ajar.

Following this forceful action, I shifted the vehicle's gear to "Park," unfastened my seatbelt, and approached the opened left side auto door from the rear of the vehicle. I engaged the passenger in dialogue, attempting to highlight the warning signage affixed to the door, which clearly stated, "Warning:

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Do Not Touch Door." I inquired as to why he disregarded this warning.

During our confrontation, the passenger, in a display of aggression, spat saliva at me, which struck my glasses and landed near my left eye. This aggressive gesture, coupled with his head movement, inadvertently resulted in his lower jaw making contact with my left eye.

Feeling threatened and concerned for my personal safety, I promptly returned to my vehicle and dialed 999 to report the incident.

Law enforcement personnel arrived within a few minutes, given our proximity to a police post situated a couple of blocks away. Officer Shane documented my injuries, specifically my injured left eye and my glasses, which bore stains of saliva. I formally requested both Officer Shane and Officer Akashi to submit my glasses for DNA testing; however, my request was declined. I subsequently reiterated my request to Officer Shane, urging the investigating officer to reconsider the DNA test, but he informed me that this request had also been rejected.

In a final attempt to seek resolution, I requested to speak with the duty Assistant Superintendent (ASP) regarding the DNA testing requests. Officer Shane advised me that the ASP had declined to meet with me.
