On 07/12/2017 at about 2130hrs, I was driving my vehicle (SJW6888B) along Buyong Rd wanting to turn right into Cavenagh Rd as I was driving home. The traffic light at the junction was a red light. There was a long queue at the outermost lane to turn right. I then saw that there was a gap in between a car and a taxi (SHF2T), as such I signaled and slowly entered the lane as that was the only lane to turn to Cavenagh Rd from Buyong Rd. However, after a while, the taxi started to inch forward and brushed his vehicle against mine. The passenger sitting in front of the taxi wind down the window and started gesturing and scolding my wife and I. Subsequently, both that passenger and the taxi driver then came





out of their vehicle, and the passenger continued gesticulating aggressively and hurling vulgarities towards us. When the light turned green, I then drove off to the nearest police station with the intention to report this matter. The taxi driver followed me all the way from Cavenagh Rd to the police station.

The vulgarities used by the passenger was "what the fuck are you doing?". Both the passenger and driver kept wanting us to exit the vehicle and settle the matter. However, we felt threatened and afraid by their gestures and language as such we decided to drive to the nearest police station. I have an in-car camera in my vehicle. There are long scratches and a slight dent at the front driver side door of my vehicle. I wish to state that the passenger who kept gesturing towards us smelt strongly of alcohol. I am lodging this report as I am still unsure if I want to pursue this matter.

- Issue an order to the police to conduct investigations if the Magistrate assessed that further inquiry is required.
- Issue an order for all parties involved to attend mediation and/or a case conference.
- Dismiss the complaint if it is without basis or if it is a civil matter or the complaint does not disclose an offence punishable by law. Your complaint may also be dismissed if you failed to attend the mediation session as per the order of the Magistrate.

5 It is an offence under section 181 of the Penal Code to make a false statement on oath to a Magistrate, which carries mandatory imprisonment for up to 3 years and a fine.
