The undercarriage were already physically damaged as seen by the orientation of the front wheels. This was explained in my previous email but seems to have not been taken into consideration, judging from your email below. Because the front right wheel was still fixed onto the wheel hub of the vehicle, this had provided a support to the undercarriage parts. Once there was no more support (wheel removed), the physical damage was clearly seen.

With regard to the aluminium/high strength steel comment in your second paragraph, your email appears to suggest that aluminium/high strength steel parts are unbreakable from an impact, when read collectively with the first paragraph.

You may want to get your in house surveyor to re-look into that comment.

This case was previously flagged by your colleagues on the consistency of the damage to the undercarriage, in particular the breakage of the undercarriage parts which were not seen during the first survey.

I have reviewed the matter and note that at the time of first survey, the front right wheel was already misaligned as compared to the front left wheel. From the photos, the front right wheel was turned towards the left as compared to the front left wheel, which was in a straight position. This is an indication that the undercarriage at the front right wheel was physically damaged from an impact directly at the front right wheel of the TP vehicle. Refer to photo 63 and 64 in Merimen. You can also see this same condition, in the reporting photos of the TP vehicle at page 11, 12, 21 and 22.

Subsequently, when the front right undercarriage parts were dismantled, physical damage was seen to almost all the parts like the lower arm, shock absorber etc. The damage to the drive shaft is shown in photo 128 and 129 in Merimen. The ball joint of the drive shaft was dislodged from its coupling at the output side of the gearbox.



The lower arm is shown in 137 and 138 in Merimen. It was observed to be broken.



There is no wheel alignment prior to the repair for this case as the condition of the front left wheel (straight) and front right wheel (turned towards the left) is already indicative of physical damage to the

undercarriage.

Hope the above clarifies.
