

FortisCor

We refer to our previous Preliminary Report and First Update Report dated 15 November 2021. We now report finally as follows:

SUMMARY OF EVENTS

To briefly recapitulate, the Insured, Leoch Battery Pte Ltd et al., trade in battery related products and services. Their head office cum warehouse is situated at 1 Tech Park Crescent, Singapore 638131 ("the risk premises"). The risk premises comprises a 3-storey industrial building of class one construction.

It was reported that at about 0852 hours on Monday, 30 August 2021, a prime mover bearing registration no. KCK1378, with attached truck trailer bearing registration no. T/WC3139 ("the Third Party Vehicle"), had reversed into and impacted against a section of the boundary wall at the front entrance to the risk premises.

The Insured recorded the particulars of the driver of the Third Party Vehicle, one Mr Mohamad Irwan Bin Annuar ("Mr Irwan"). Our enquiries have since revealed that the Third Party Vehicle is owned and/or operated by Empire Global Transport Sdn Bhd ("Empire Global"), a logistics firm based in Malaysia.

We are satisfied that the loss was accidental insofar as the Insured are concerned.

POLICY LIABILITY

As mentioned in our Preliminary Report, we opine that policy liability is engaged in principle, subject to a deductible of S\$250.00 each and every claim in respect of Any other claim.

CLAIM AND ADJUSTMENT

The Insured submitted a claim amounting to S\$17,520.00 for the damage to the risk premises' boundary wall and an acrylic signage mounted thereon.

Having completed our investigation into the nature and extent of damage, we shall submit our comments on our proposed adjustment as follows:

Section 1 Item 1 - On Building (With United Overseas Bank Limited as Mortgagee Interest) (Sum Insured: \$\$6,400,000.00)

During our attendance, we noted that the affected section of the boundary wall was badly damaged by the impact. The granite tiles on the front and rear of the boundary wall were cracked / misaligned and had dislodged. The acrylic signage had also been dislodged from its mounting and was cracked.

FortisCor

The Insured had, from the outset, submitted two competitive quotations for the reinstatement of the damaged items, which are presented as follows:

Stone Harvest Pte Ltd	25,450.00	Annexe B

We reviewed the submitted quotations and noted that the quoted scope of reinstatement works was generally consistent with our site findings and would fall within the policy description of the insured property and the policy endorsements, including the Outbuilding Clause, and none is excluded.

Having verified the scope of reinstatement works, we next proceeded to scrutinise the costing claimed. We are mindful that since the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, construction costs have risen drastically due to an industry-wide lack of manpower / materials. Hence, we found that the costing submitted by Skye Renovation was reasonable and consistent with the prevailing market rates.

Notwithstanding the above, we have also invited an independent contractor, Big Red Pte Ltd ("Big Red"), to inspect the damaged items and submit a 3rd competitive quotation for comparison purposes. A copy of Big Red's quotation, amounting to S\$22,050.00, is enclosed as **Annexe C**.

Based on the foregoing, as the quotation submitted by Skye Renovation was the most economically priced, the Insured had engaged them to undertake the reinstatement of the damaged items. The reinstatement works were eventually completed, and a copy of the contractor's invoice is enclosed as **Annexe D**.

The policy is endorsed with the Reinstatement Value clause. As the reinstatement had been effected, deduction for depreciation would not be warranted.

Based on the foregoing, the Insured's claim for the damage to the risk premises' boundary wall and an acrylic signage mounted thereon at **\$\$17,520.00** has our recommendation.

Salvage

We opine that the debris of the damaged items does not retain any realisable salvage value.

Adequacy of Sum Insured

The adjusted loss falls well within the limit of S\$100,000.00 provided under the Appraisement Clause, hence average is not a factor for consideration.

Deductible

A deductible of S\$250.00 is applicable each and every claim in respect of Any other claim.

FortisCor

Hence, Insurers' ultimate liability emerges at \$\$17,270.00 (being \$\$17,520.00 less \$\$250.00).

THIRD PARTY ASPECT

The Third Party Vehicle is a Malaysia-registered vehicle and is owned and/or operated by Empire Global, a logistics firm based in Malaysia.

Based on past claims we have handled involving subrogation against a Malaysia-registered vehicle and/or their Insurers, the recovery process will usually be tedious and drawn out.

Nevertheless, should Insurers concur with our adjustment proposal, we will be writing to the Empire Global to inform them of the finalised quantum.

OTHER INSURANCE

None advised by the Insured.

REMARKS

Subject to Insurers' final approval, we would recommend that the claim be disposed off at the adjusted amount of **\$\$17,270.00**, by payment to the Insured.

We now await the benefit of Insurer's concluding instructions.
